# **Rural Coffee Connect**

# Our journey to help tackle loneliness in rural areas one cup at a time.

With a £100,000 grant from The National Lottery Community Fund already confirmed, we have spent the last few months working hard to put the foundations in place for Rural Coffee Connect.

Officially starting in the autumn, Rural Coffee Connect will hit the roads of Leicestershire and Rutland taking our pop-up café into the heart of rural communities providing an informal, no strings social space for people to meet and build connections with others in their community.

From a fundraising perspective, progress has been fantastic. In April our board of trustees made the decision to invest some of the funds released from the sale of our old office accommodation in Leicester into the project and in June we were delighted to be awarded a £10,000 Shire Community Grant by Leicestershire County Council.



In early July we picked up our brand-new Coffee Connect van which will be undergoing conversion over the next couple of months. Along side this we will be working with partners to develop our loneliness awareness training package which will be delivered through Rural Coffee Connect to help people take simple steps to identify, reach and help people within their community suffering from loneliness.

# Market Bosworth Town Centre Redevelopment Project

Following on from the successful development of a Neighbourhood Plan, the whole community was engaged in a variety of activities to help develop and agree a redesign of the town centre.

#### **Hathern Together**

Set up in 2018, Hathern Together is a community led initiative to bring together clubs, societies and organisations within the village to work together providing and promoting improved facilities, services, activities and events.

To commemorate the centenary of the ending of WW1 fifty-three local men marched from Hugglescote Church to Coalville Train station recreating the march of the first fifty civilian volunteers in the country to land in France in 1914.

# Woodhouse & Woodhouse Eaves Good Neighbour Scheme

Delivered by a team of 38 volunteers the scheme reaches out and helps people in the Parish including lifts to appointments or social events, befriending and support with everyday tasks.

# Market Bosworth CIC - Enjoy Market Bosworth Website

www.marketbosworth.org aims to be 'the single point of information' for the town including a calendar of events and a directory of all businesses, community organisations and groups.

#### Syston and District Volunteer Centre

Celebrating its 40th year, the Centre provides safe and convenient transport for those without a car and that are not able to make use of public transport.

#### Leicestershire & Rutland PFA - Loan Scheme

The loan scheme is marketed as a lender of first resort, rather than of last resort. This means applicants can use the loan facility as leverage with grant funders or donors for projects which may otherwise not get off the ground.

#### **Access Generation CIC**

A social enterprise which aims to encourage businesses to employ inexperienced young people and empower young people and business to make the world of work more accessible.



#### **Thrussington Village Store**

A family run independent village shop with a deli and tearoom in the beautiful Leicestershire village of Thrussington.

## **Farmer Barnes Dairy**

A proud working British Dairy Farm in Somerby that has installed a unique 'Cow Classroom' next to the milking parlour where the community is invited in to find out about milk production.

#### The Geese and Fountain

Re-opened by new owners and with a new name, The Geese and Fountain is a traditional inn in the village of Croxton Kerrial committed to local brewers, local food producers and providing a range of community services.

#### **Root and Branch Out CIC**

A Rutland based community interest company set up to engage communities in projects around food and the outdoors, nature and the environment.



Best Community Library

#### Leicester Forest East Community Library

Having celebrated its third anniversary in December 2018, the Library continues to steadily achieve its aim of becoming a HUB for the community by constantly listening and responding to the needs and wants of the local community.



# Glen Hills Community Managed Library and Park Cafe

The Glen Parva based library and café are open 32 hours per week and run entirely by an enthusiastic and committed team of volunteers. The onsite café provides a vital facility for local people to connect and helps to generate income to cover running expenses of the Library.

#### **Sileby Community Library**

Run solely by volunteers, the Library is a focal point for the village and provides a valuable community facility and service. Starting in March 2018, the Library has been completely refurbished to provide a more modern environment, facilitate broader use and to create a friendly 'book shop' atmosphere.

# Measham and District Community Library

A purpose-built volunteer run library in the heart of the village. In addition to traditional library services the facility also offers a range of other valuable community services to support disadvantaged people in the area including a food bank.


